Rules & Regulations	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Any Variety may be exhibited. 2. Exhibitor must have assisted in harvest & cultivation except class of "Vegetable Art". 3. All entries must be labeled as to Name & Variety of entry or entry will be penalized. 4. Exhibitors are encouraged to refresh their exhibit midweek; especially Vegetable Art & Scarecrows. 5. Exhibit information is available at Cornell Cooperative Extension Office (518-746-2560 or 800-548-0881)

SECTION: GARDEN PROJECT

CLASSES:

- Beans—**Green pod variety**—10 pods
- Beans—**Yellow pod variety**—10 pods
- Beans—**Lima**—6 pods
- Beets—3 clean, tops trimmed ½" to 1"
- Cabbage—1 head w/roots off
- Carrots—3 of any variety, w/tops trimmed ½" to 1"
- Cauliflower—1 head w/roots off & trimmed
- Chard— 1 plant w/roots off, not over 24"
- Cucumbers—**Pickling type**—10 for small pickles of any variety
- Cucumbers—**Slicing type**—2 slicing condition of any variety
- Eggplant—1 of any variety
- Garlic—5 bulbs
- Herbs—3 stems per variety (**limit of 3 entries per exhibitor**)
- Lettuce—1 plant w/roots off & cleaned, any variety
- Muskmelon—1 mature, any variety
- Onions—3 mature bulbs, tops trimmed ½" to 1" (**unpeeled**)
- Peppers—**Sweet**—3 specimens
- Potatoes—3 tubers of any variety, **1 entry per variety (limit of 2 varieties per exhibitor)**
- Pumpkin—**Field type**—1 specimen
- Pumpkin—**Pie type**—1 specimen
- Squash—**Summer type**—2 specimens of any green or yellow variety, young & tender
- Squash—**Winter type**—1 specimen of any variety
- Sweet Corn—3 ears, one side of husks removed completely
- Tomatoes—3 ripe of any variety, stems off
- Green Tomatoes—3 of any variety, stems off
- Watermelon—1 mature specimen of any variety

SECTION: GARDEN PROJECT cont

CLASSES:

- Other Vegetable Not Listed**— 1 entry per vegetable (**limit of 2 per exhibitor**) list veggie on entry
- Novelty Class**—any vegetable of a strange or unusual shape, list veggie type on entry
- Vegetable Art**—make a sculpture from 1 or more types of vegetables (**4—H Office has a project guide, Call for more information: 518-746-2560**)

- Largest Pumpkin**—hard—fluted stem, Ribbon only award
- Largest Zucchini**—Ribbon only award
- Best Dressed Cucumber**—Ribbon only award

SECTION: SMALL GRAINS

Rules & Regulations	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Must be a Home Farm Product.2. Exhibitor must have assisted in harvest & cultivation.3. Exhibitor must select his/her own exhibit.4. Freedom from insect & disease damage, and apparent seed and/or feeding value will be considered in judging.
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CLASSES: Unthreshed sheaf with a minimum of 6" diameter

- Oats**
- Oats & Barley Mix**
- Mature Sunflower**—grown for seeds (for Ornamental Sunflower—See Dept.: YOUTH ORNAMENTAL HORTICULTURE)
- Other Small Grain**—list specimen on entry form

CLASSES: Best Forage

- Corn 2019**—3 ears, no husks
- Corn 2018**—3 ears, no husks
- Corn Silage 2019**
- Corn Silage 2018**
- Hay Silage 2019**
- Hay Silage 2018**

*NOTE: Silage may be displayed in a 1 gallon clear glass or clear plastic container.

SECTION: HAY CLASSES

Rules & Regulations	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. See Rules for "Small Grains"2. Specimens should be a 6" to 10" section of a field bale SECURELY tied.3. Apparent feed value will be highly important in judging. Presence of foreign material, weeds, insect & disease damage, & plants not representative of class will be considered undesirable for highest awards.
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CLASSES:

- Alfalfa**—mostly all alfalfa, list other types in specimen
- Clover**—mostly all trefoil, list other types in specimen
- Mixed Grass Hay**
- Mixed Legumes**
- Timothy Hay**
- Trefoil**—mostly all trefoil, list other types in specimen

SECTION: FARM PRODUCE

Rules & Regulations	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Specimens must be a Home Farm Product.2. Exhibitor must have assisted in harvest & cultivations.3. Exhibitor must select his/her own exhibit.

SECTION: MAPLE SYRUP

-Glass Jar of Table Grade A—Golden color, delicate taste

-Glass Jar of Table Grade A—Amber color, rich taste

-Glass Jar of Table Grade A—Dark color, robust taste

SECTION: GARDEN SCARECROW

Rules & Regulations	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Free Standing scarecrows should be 3—5 feet tall and use no more than 3 feet of floor space.2. At least 5 fresh vegetables and/or fruits must be used in your design.3. The scarecrow must be named & a list of the vegetables/fruits used along with their location in your design must accompany your exhibit.4. SET UP times will be SATURDAY before Fair @ 9am—3pm and MONDAY Opening day @10am—12:30pm.5. Exhibitors must be present for face to face judging @1:30 pm MONDAY, Opening Day.6. Exhibitors are encourage to refresh their exhibit midweek.
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CLASSES:

-Individual Exhibitor Scarecrow

-Group of Exhibitors Scarecrow—each person must enter this class on their youth entry form, also Identifying that it is a GROUP entry.
