

Quick Reference Guide of Animal Health Requirements for Washington County Fair 2021

Cattle, horses, goats, sheep and swine must be vaccinated for rabies at least 14 days prior to arrival on the Fairgrounds and not more than 365 days prior to opening day of Fair.

Species	Health Requirements
CATTLE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -CVI (Certified Veterinarian Inspection) is required. -Bovine Respiratory Disease Vaccination (BVD) for animals over 3 months of age is required. -Rabies Vaccination for those 4 mos. of age and older and <u>administered at least 14 days prior to opening day of Fair and not more than 365 days prior to opening day of Fair.</u> -For 2021 Cattle must be identified by an official USDA approved eartag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) eartags, commonly referred to as <u>"840 RFID tags", are strongly recommended.</u> Call 518-457-3502 with further questions (and free eartags).
EQUINE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -A valid Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA/Coggins) test is required for all horses 6mos. of age or older. <u>The sample collection date for qualifying EIA test must have been on or after January 1, 2020 for NY origin horses.</u> For imported horses, the EIA test must have been conducted within 12 months prior to entry. -Rabies Vaccination is required for all horses 4 mos. of age or older and <u>administered at least 14 days prior to opening day of Fair and not more than 365 days prior to opening day of Fair.</u> -CVI is required for all imported horses.
GOATS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -CVI (Certified Veterinarian Inspection), herd of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year. -USDA approved Scrapie Identification -Rabies Vaccination (for animals 4 months of age or older) is required and <u>administered at least 14 days prior to opening day of Fair and not more than 365 days prior to opening day of Fair.</u>
SHEEP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -CVI (Certified Veterinarian Inspection), herd of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year. -USDA approved Scrapie Identification -Rabies Vaccination (for animals 4 months of age or older) is required and <u>administered at least 14 days prior to opening day of Fair and not more than 365 days prior to opening day of Fair.</u>
SWINE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -CVI (Certified Veterinarian Inspection), herd of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year. -Rabies Vaccination (for animals 4 months of age or older) is required and <u>administered at least 14 days prior to opening day of Fair and not more than 365 days prior to opening day of Fair.</u> -For 2021 Swine must be identified by an official USDA approved eartag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) eartags, commonly referred to as <u>"840 RFID tags", are strongly recommended.</u> Call 518-457-3502 with further questions (and free eartags).
POULTRY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -A negative Pullorum/Typhoid test is required within 90 days of exhibition. -Waterfowl are exempt from this requirement. Testing is being held on July 16 from 1:00pm-5:30pm at the Washington County Fairgrounds.
RABBITS/CAVIES	Each rabbit is to have a permanent tattoo in its LEFT EAR prior to the Fair. A tattoo clinic will be held prior to the Fair (contact the Fair Office 518-692-2464 or CCE Office 518-746-2560)

GENERAL REGISTRATION & OWNERSHIP OF ALL LIVESTOCK

Department	Registration & Ownership
YOUTH	<p>All YOUTH livestock shall be owned and registered/transfer of ownership in the exhibitor's name by June 15th of the current year.</p> <p>All registration papers are due to the Entry Office with entries. However, they will be accepted up to AUGUST 2nd. This is so that the Entry Office may ensure correct exhibitor ownership and correctness of classes entered.</p>
OPEN	<p>All OPEN livestock shall be owned and registered/transfer of ownership in the exhibitor's name by July 15th of the current year.</p> <p>All registration papers are due to the Entry Office with entries for age verification and ownership. However, they will be accepted up through Monday, August 2nd.</p>
