Arrival & Dismissal	Horses staying in the barn for the week must be in their assigned stall by 5:30pm Monday of Fair and may not leave until Sunday at 9:30pm when Fair is over. Stalls must be cleaned by the exhibitor then checked and okayed by the Barn Supt. before leaving. This includes your tack & feed stall.	
Health Requirements	Exhibitors must present an original Coggins (EIA Test) & Rabies certificate when horses are checked on to the grounds. See the front of this Handbook for more details about health requirements. "A negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test is required for all horses 6 months of age or older. The horse must be accompanied by a valid negative EIA test record. The sample collection date for qualifying EIA test must have been on or after January 1, 2019 for NY origin horses . Rabies .vaccination must be within 1 year of opening day of Fair& be documented by a signed Rabies Certificate or a signed statement on the EIA test chart. The Barn Superintendent will document the information on the Entry Office Health Certification Information– Horses– Washington County Fair.	
Rules & Regulations	 IF YOU ARE NOT PRE-ENTERED, YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO SHOW. YOU MUST BE PRE-ENTERED. Post Marked entries are due to the Entry Office by Wednesday, July 22nd. Hand Delivered to the Entry Office by Friday, July 24th (6pm). On-Line Entries to be SUBMITTED by Monday, July 27th by midnight. ALL exhibitors in Youth Shows are required to wear a properly fitted helmet which is USPC (Pony Club) or ASTM/SEI approved. All participants must sign the entry form which includes a liability release. Minors (under the age of 18 yrs.) MUST have a parent or legal guardian's signature on the entry form. No Stallions are allowed. Each exhibitor is responsible for knowing the rules regarding all shows and gymkhana. Exhibitors may only enter ONE age division. -Beginner: 10 yrs. of age & under (as of Jan. 1 of this year). -Youth: Walk/Trot/Jog Riders 11yrs. old to 19yrs. old (must be 18 as of Jan. 1st of this year) -Junior: Riders 13yrs. old & Under -Senior: Riders 14yrs. old to 19yrs. old (must be 18 as of Jan. 1st of this year) 	
Barn/Exercise Area	 Only horses assigned a stall will be allowed in the barn area. All Stall Requests must be submitted with entry form & by entry deadlines. Stalls will be assigned by the Youth Barn Superintendent. They will be reserved on a first come, first served basis. Everyone is personally responsible for their tack & equipment, and will supply their own pails, bedding, feed, cleaning tools, etc. Any Exhibitor who shows evidence of unethical practices will be dismissed. Cooperation from exhibitors is requested to insure the safety of all. Exercising will be allowed ONLY in the designated areas. NO RIDING DOUBLE AT ANY TIME. Any animal with a tendency to kick other horses or people MUST wear a RED RIBBON in its tail AT ALL TIMES when outside of stall. Horses must not be left unattended outside of their stall. Horses may not be mounted in the tent. 	
Show Rules & Regulations	 Classes may be divided or combined at the discretion of the show superintendent. The Judge or Show Supt. may dismiss any exhibitor from the ring if in their opinion, the horse is lame, unmanageable, or the exhibitor displays poor sportsmanship. AQHA Rules will be used as guidelines for this show. Dropped nosebands, martingales, mechanical hackamores, draw reins, or other illegal equipment as specified in the show rule book will not be allowed while showing. Slip on spurs are NOT Permitted. On show day, exhibitors bringing in horses should enter grounds off Old Schuylerville Road & follow signs To HORSE AREA.
