Health Requirements	<p>-Poultry (with the exception of doves, pigeons, & waterfowl) must be accompanied by the following paperwork: a) Results of a Negative Pullorum – Typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition OR b) Proof that the birds originate directly from a US Pullorum – Typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock. See the Ag. & Markets requirements of this handbook for additional information.</p> <p>-Pullorum – Typhoid testing will be announced by Cornell Cooperative Extension Office. Please call for information (518-746-2560). It is usually held at the Fairgrounds in June or July. You may also check the NY State Ag. & Markets website.</p> <p>-It is recommended that no birds be shown from commercial flocks.</p> <p>-All birds should be moved to and from the Fair in clean, disinfected crates and trunk.</p> <p>-All possible precautions should be used to prevent tracking disease agents from exhibit to other premises.</p> <p>-Exhibited birds should not be returned to home premises or any other premise where birds are harbored.</p>
Ownership	Birds must have been owned by the exhibitor for at least 30 days prior to exhibition date.

Required Paperwork to Turn in	All livestock Exhibitors are required to turn in the following with their Entry Forms: Stall/Coop Request
Stall/Coop/Pen Request	Superintendents will try to honor stall requests in placing animals, however, due to space limitations exhibitors may not get the location requested. For the Online Stall Request, please submit 1 Stall Request per species of animal. Stall Assignment information will be available after 9am Friday prior to Fair. No one other than the Barn Superintendent may make changes in the assignments.
Mandatory Meeting	Thursday prior to Fair @ 6:30pm there will be a Mandatory Barn Meeting in the Poultry Barn. All are required to attend.
Arrival	<p>-Poultry exhibits may arrive Sunday between 2:00pm—6:00pm and Monday 8:00am—4:00pm.</p> <p>-All poultry are to be in place by 5:00pm Monday, Opening Day of Fair.</p> <p>-Vet Check – look for schedule in your barn or contact your superintendent. You will need to have your Negative Pullorum Test paperwork.</p>
Dismissal	All livestock may be walked off the grounds @ 9:30pm Sunday using the designated Dismissal Paths (see maps in Exhibitor Envelope. Gates for vehicle traffic will open @ 10:00pm.

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<p>Who is Eligible to Show?</p>	<p>1. Entries to the Washington County Fair, Inc. are open to residents of Washington County Only. Youth may attend a school in Washington County, be a member of a 4-H Club, FFA, or Scouts in Washington County.</p> <p>2. Exception for Livestock: If the primary farm is located & operated in Washington County, but the owner is a non-resident, they will be allowed to exhibit their animals at the Fair.</p> <p>3. <i>Due to the COVID 19 pandemic and the 2020 Fair being cancelled, The Fair Board as decided to Extend the age of youth by 1 year. Youth Exhibitors must be 5 yrs of age by Dec. 1, 2021 & under 20 yrs of age as of Jan 1st 2021. (can be 19 yrs of age as of Jan. 1, 2021)</i></p>
<p>Rules & Regulations For Open & Youth Exhibitors & Shows</p>	<p>1. Birds must be of acceptable age and condition or the superintendent will reject the entry.</p> <p>2. All birds will be fed and cared for without charge. Coops will be furnished as far as possible.</p> <p>3. Exhibitors should be present for judging in this department.</p> <p>4. Single exhibitors in a class shall receive a second award unless the judge deems the exhibit outstanding.</p> <p>5. All Chickens, Ducks, Turkeys, and Geese will be judged according to the Standards of Perfection. Youth Departments will be judged using the Danish System: each exhibit judged is based on those Standards.</p> <p>6. The Superintendent will create a separate class if there are at least 3 entries of the same breed in a class.</p> <p>7. Please see Superintendents on Monday to sign up for assisting in WATERING & FEEDING throughout FAIR WEEK.</p> <p>8. AWARDS NIGHT IS Wednesday Night @ 7:00pm</p> <p>9. For any animal that needs to leave the Fairgrounds before the conclusion of the Fair, the exhibitor MUST inform the Superintendent who then needs to inform the Entry Office. The State Vet is required to evaluate the animal before it leaves the grounds and complete the appropriate paper work and file it in the Entry Office before the animal leaves the premises as per Ag & Markets regulations.</p>
<p>Limits</p>	<p>1. Limit of two(2) entries per any one class may be made by one (1) exhibitor. Example: 2 Barred Rock PULLETS or 2 Rhode Island Red HENS. You may enter more than one class for each breed – Example: 2 Barred Rock PULLETS and 2 Barred Rock COCKERELS and 1 Barred Rock OLD TRIO.</p> <p>2. Limit of 30 ENTRIES per EXHIBITOR.</p> <p>3. Only Chickens can be shown as TRIOs which consists of 1 Male & 2 Females and may not be entered as single entries in this department.</p> <p>4. All Entries will be entered by BREED & VARIETY. If you do not know the Breed or Variety, PLEASE CALL your Superintendents! They are more than happy to help you with the identification of your birds.</p>

Photo is to be 5" x 7" without a frame. Ribbons will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each of the following age groups below. The judging will be based on the child and the bird not the photography skills involved.

No Entry Fee, RIBBON ONLY AWARD. Contestants may sign up in the Poultry Barn the day of the Contest. Participants will dress their bird and will then place them in numbered cages outside the Poultry Barn. The public will then vote on their favorite.

CLASSES: OPEN ONLY

-Rooster Crowing Contest—\$1.00 entry fee (Wednesday through Thursday @ 6pm)

Special Award— a ribbon to the champion bird

Laryngitis Award—a ribbon to each exhibitor in the contest whose bird did not crow during any part of the competition.

The contest will be based solely on the number of "crows" during a specific 15-minute period. The volume, tone, musical quality and other features of a rooster's crow will not be taken into consideration. The rooster having the most crows recorded to his credit at the end of the week (after Thursday's contest) will be deemed "THE CHAMPION".

Any breed/variety of poultry entered in regular classes are eligible. **YOU MUST PRE ENTER ON THE ENTRY FORM.**

Exhibitors or their representatives are to be present each night and are responsible for seeing that their bird(s) are placed in the competition and returned to their own coop.

Exhibitors may enter a total of 2 roosters.

-Human Crowing Contest—Saturday @ 6pm

NO entry fee. Ribbon only award. Contestants may sign up in the Poultry Barn the day of the contest. Participants will be lined up outside the Poultry Barn, given a number, and a chance to "crow" The public will then vote for their favorite.
